1. Chair's Address

2. Minutes of 6 September 2021 AGM

Terry O'Neill asked why his motion from 2021 was not actioned. Martin Grimley apologised. The motion had been passed at the 2021 CIORC AGM but was not taken forward to the 2021 Cycling Ireland AGM to be ratified. Martin has already written the motion onto the official Cycling Ireland AGM form and assured Terry it will be admitted this year.



3. Discipline reports

<u>Cross-country (XC)</u> – presented by Caroline Martinez.

- 5 rounds of the National Point Series (NPS) held this year. Thanks to Scott Cycles for their support of the series with banners, flags and prizes for the podium riders.
- More input from Cycling Ireland. New podium backdrop, CI photographer, more social media. Featured on monthly TV show.
- A successful National XC Championships held at Bellurgan Park. Thanks to Bryan McCrystal and Bellurgan Wheelers for hosting. We received a yellow flag for Junior men, Under 16 girls and Under 14 girls when there were less than 6 on the start line.
- Travis Harkness sent to World XC Championships but got injured before the start of the race.
- Planning for 2023 is underway. National XC Championships will return to Bellurgan Park in July.
- XC Conference planned to discuss race schedules, rider development and rider pathway.

<u>Cyclo-cross (CX)</u> – presented by Paul Birchall

- UCI C2 Clonmel (1st year)
- Provincial and National Championships went ahead
- We have a yellow flag on Masters Women at the National Championships when there were less than 6 on the start line
- o Great numbers at the Youth CX National Championships

- Season looking healthy, events being registered
- o UCI C2 Clonmel going ahead
- o Regional championships 11 December 2022

<u>Downhill (DH)</u> – presented by Martin Grimley

- Two of the three rounds of Irish Downhill Mountain Bike Series (IDMS) have been held. Great numbers.
- More input from Cycling Ireland. New podium backdrop, CI photographer, more social media. Featured on monthly TV show.
- DH National Championships held in Bree. Excellent attendance. We got a yellow flag for the number of M50 riders when we had less than 6 starting.
- Ireland had riders at the DH World Championships in Les Gets France with Henry Kerr getting into the top 10 in the Elite men.
- Planning for 2023 to get underway
- National DH Championships 2023 will be at The GAP
- DH Conference planned for October to discuss rider development, pathway.

Enduro - presented by Al Redmond

- A full calendar this year starting with 2 enduro and finishing with the GAP team enduro.
- National Championships took place in July at Ravensdale. Good numbers but not as good as 2021 and 2019. The event did use Eventmaster for the first time.
- More input from Cycling Ireland. New podium backdrop, CI photographer, more social media. Featured on monthly TV show.
- Youth Assessment days took place with 39 riders assessed this year
- Two enduro training days took place in January and May
- Assessing whether we can take teams to the Trophy of Nations
- Planning to begin shortly for 2022 season.
- National Enduro Championships 2023 will be held by Biking.ie on 19/20 August

<u>Club MTB Trails</u> – presented by Kevin Moran

- Since 12 Feb 2021 Coillte, Cycling Ireland and the Off-road Commission have been in discussions regarding Club MTB Trails.
- We had developed a Code of Conduct, Protocol, Heads of Agreement, Signage and a licence template for the club.
- Towards the end of 2021 Coillte had changed the set up from a licence for each club to Cycling Ireland having one licence to cover all clubs.
- This lead to some insurance questions around where the liability between CI and Coillte lay. Since December 2021 this has been kicking around between both insurance companies.
- We currently have 3 clubs started (Donegal MTB, IMBRC and Bree MTB) with 17 clubs on the waiting list.



Women's Report - presented by Bernie Commins

- Bernie providing a link between the Women's Commission and the Off-road Commission
- Four training sessions planned, enduro based. Two at the GAP with Gavin Carroll in March and two at Cahir with Killian Callaghan.
- Another two training sessions are planned for the GAP

	the number and type of events and the period of assessment that is considered in
	the criteria
	the number of positions available to be filled, and the method of selecting
	riders in the event that more riders apply than there are positions available.
	the available funding to support the riders and how it will be distributed amongst
	them
	3. That in the interests of keeping costs down for junior riders interested in trying
	for selection, the selection criteria be weighted towards the BDS and C1 events in
	the UK, or equivalent.
	4. That in the interests of growing the sport nationally, Cycling Ireland commit to
	selecting enough riders from those that meet the minimum qualifying criteria to
	fill all the available world championship places, and that juniors and women
	should always be represented, even if that means the funding per rider is

	at world championships. Ideally some British events be on the list to make it more
	feasible for riders to meet the criteria. It should also be stated whether strong
	results in Irish downhill races, particularly the national championships, are a key
	factor or not.
	b) That it is outlined how many spots will be available for each category (men,
	women, and juniors) to compete at world championships. This is to give everyone
	hoping to be a selected a sense, but of course not a guarantee, of what their chances will be.
	c) That Cycling Ireland uses up all of the allocated rider spots given by UCI for
	world championships. This is to provide more opportunities for riders to race at
	this level and to guarantee spots for women's and more spots for juniors.
	d) That rider funding given by Cycling Ireland for world championships be given
	via a separate application process (or to the top 10 or so competitors). This is to
	avoid budget being a limiting factor of using up all racer spots offered by UCI for
	world championships but still provide all financial support possible.
